From the Pastor

COME, DRINK FROM THE FONT OF EVERY BLESSING

Cast all your anxiety on Him because He cares for you. (1 Peter 5:7)

Some of you have probably seen it in Wyoming, at Yellowstone National Park. I'd venture (hope at least) that most American school children know of and can name the natural geological phenomenon that, like clockwork every 91 minutes, spews a tower of water 125 feet skyward. Since 1870, because of its predictable expulsions, "it" has been affectionately dubbed *Old Faithful*.

Must we trek to Wyoming to see the lone example of well-ordered faithfulness in the universe? Of course not! Other well-ordered natural phenomena abound. One has just officially occurred, that continues to unfold daily. At 12:57 P.M. on March 20, winter officially yielded to spring. This is technically known as the "vernal equinox" when, in its annual transit around the sun, the earth's tilt relative to the sun's is zero; that is, the axis of the earth points neither toward nor away from that of the sun. Like *Old Faithful*, this happens like clockwork each year, and at the same time. It is why we can count on winter always giving way to spring. *This year*, for many who share our patch of the globe, this couldn't have happened soon enough! But happen it did, yet again.

Thus, (when we take a moment to look!) we can see signs of new life and new beginnings, springing up through the ground all around us—crocuses, tulips, hyacinths, weeds! Grass is exchanging shades of brown for green. Buds are forming and blooming on trees and shrubs. We hear more bird chatter.

Breezes get warmer as the temperature climbs. The sun dips below the horizon later each day. Could we not also refer to this transit of the earth around the sun and the change of seasons it prompts as “Old Faithful”?

Ultimately though, *Old Faithful* is...well, God. God is constant. Steady. Faithful. God is faithful to be God for and with us, to love, sustain, protect, forgive, comfort, delight in, and renew us. God communicates (reveals) His faithfulness to us through His written Word, the Bible. God also sent His son Jesus to reveal God’s self to us materially, in terms we humans can understand. God also comes to us in Spirit, living within, nurturing, and sustaining us. Through Jesus’ death on the cross for us, God graciously made right humanity’s unfaithfulness to God. By trusting that Jesus reconciled humanity’s divorce from God caused by sin, we can be assured of rising, like Jesus, to new and everlasting life, in spirit, mind, and body. We get a fresh new beginning, a massive do-over, just because...God loves us. How would God have us respond? In faith and with gratitude, empowered by the Spirit to be Jesus’ faithful followers.

Are you weary, tired of life or religion, of performing for God or others? Are you running from God? Are you suffering physically, emotionally, or spiritually? Are you grieving the loss of someone or something? Is life barreling over you with stress, change, transition, or uncertainty? Are you filling your thirst for God or for legitimate God-given needs or desires in ways that are impeding or completely blocking your movement toward God or others? In this season, as season after season, you can turn to the only One who will never fail you, *Old Faithful*, Jesus.

As it happens, the seasons of the church also reflect the order and rhythm of God’s creation. In April, the Season of Lent will give way to the Season of Easter, which will in turn yield to the Season of Pentecost. During Lent, to prepare themselves to celebrate Easter freely and joyfully, many Christians intensify their usual daily spiritual disciplines. They study God’s written Word, the Bible, communicate with God in prayer, speaking and listening, they bless others as God has blessed them—by loving and serving them—and they reflect both on their walk with, toward, or away from God and God’s unswerving faithfulness to them. The practice of these disciplines stretches them, us, like an elongated Slinky®. We grow and, though our daily rhythms may change after Lent, we’re not the same. God transforms our hearts as we draw closer to Him. God implants in our hearts a desire for relational intimacy with Him and others. That is the reason for which God created us, to enjoy intimacy in right relationship with God and others, to God’s glory. Is that your desire?

If, after the seasons of Lent and Easter, we ignore or abandon communion with our ever-faithful God, what does that say about our journey to Easter through Lent? Was it just so much window dressing, going through the motions of religion? Why? For whose benefit? Not ours; not God’s. Surely no good fruit will be borne of that. Instead, for the remainder of Lent, and after Easter, why not continue, or if you hadn’t begun to do so, begin anew to hunger and thirst for God. Drink deeply from the font of every blessing, the Living Water of our Old Faithful God who makes all things new. Read and study Scripture. Pray. Serve others. Do these things with others and privately. Cast your anxiety on Him because He cares for you. The Old Faithful God of new beginnings is risen indeed, and so can you. Happy Easter Season!

The theme for Earth Day 2014 is "***The Green Cities Campaign.***"

Earth Day Network launched the Green Cities campaign in the fall of 2013 to help cities around the world become more sustainable and reduce their carbon footprint. Focused on three key elements – buildings, energy, and transportation – the campaign aims to help cities accelerate their transition to a cleaner, healthier, and more economically viable future through improvements in efficiency, investments in renewable technology, and regulation reform.

Today, more than half of the world's population lives in cities. As the urban population grows and the effects of climate change worsen, our cities have to evolve.

Spanning Earth Day 2014 and 2015, the campaign will work with an international team of partners, including local organizers, non-profits, businesses, and governments to help increase public awareness, mobilize support for appropriate policies, and generate concrete commitments for innovative and replicable initiatives.

It's time for us to invest in efficiency and renewable energy, rebuild our cities and towns, and begin to solve the climate crisis. Over the next two years, with a focus on Earth Day 2014, the Green Cities campaign will mobilize a global movement to accelerate this transition.





I reasoned, "That's because he doesn't have the capacity to ask why bad things happen to good dogs." But then a thought occurred: Perhaps if God revealed the answers, our human minds wouldn't have the capacity to understand. So maybe Mocha had the right idea. Maybe it's better not to waste time wondering why and just be thankful instead for what we have.

Christian Reflections

A Father's Promise

Ten years ago (1989), an 8.2 earthquake almost flattened Armenia, killing over 30,000 people in less than four minutes. It's hard to imagine the anguish, the pain, and the suffering that began in those four brief minutes of time -- people's worlds were shaken and lives crushed. In spite of the devastation, such tragedies often bring out the best in people -- at least it provides a window to peak at the contents of each heart. Let me show you the loving heart of one father.

In the midst of chaos and destruction, he rushed to his son's school. But instead of a school, he found a shapeless heap of rubble. Imagine what went through his mind. What would have gone through your mind? Perhaps, shock would have crippled you as it did the other parents who were walking around dazed, clutching at their hearts and calling out their child's name. But in the case of this father, the sight of rubble and ruin only made him spring into action. He ran to the back corner of the building where his son's class room used to be and began to dig. Why? What real hope did he have? What were the chances that his son could have survived such destruction? All he knew was that he had made a promise to always be there for his son. It was this promise that gave strength to his body and motivated him mentally.

As he began to dig, well-meaning parents tried to pull him out of the rubble saying: "It's too late!" "They're dead!" "You can't help!" "Go home!" "There's nothing you can do!" The fire chief tried to pull him off the rubble by saying, "Fires and explosions are happening everywhere. You're in danger. Go home!" Finally, the police came and said, "You're angry, distraught, but it's over. Go home." But this father had made a promise, and he was going to keep it!

The love this father had in his heart for his son kept him digging for eight . . . 12 . . . 24 . . . 36 hours. Then, in the 38th hour, he pulled back a boulder and heard his sons' voice crying for help. Immediately, he screamed, "ARMAND!" Back came the words, "Dad!? I told them! I told the other kids that if you were still alive, you'd save me! You promised me, you said you'd always be there for me! You did it, Dad!"

A determined father, a promise kept, and a stone rolled away to reveal life and give freedom. The story of Armand's dad reminds us of the events of that first Easter when our Heavenly Father kept a greater promise by rolling away a much more significant stone. With the rolling away of that stone, came eternal life, and true lasting freedom in Christ! And you know what? Our Heavenly Father is still in the business of rolling away stones.

What are the stones in your life? It doesn't matter how big or small they may be. Our Father is looking for you right now. He's looking through the rubble and the ruin of lives not lived for Him, and He wants to roll away your stone of despair, your rock of remorse, your boulder of bondage. May you remember, or perhaps even discover for the first time, that our God has made the greatest promises ever made, and He is abundantly able to keep them all, just as He kept that very special promise to His own Son some two thousand years ago.
