# FROM THE PASTOR'S DESK:

# All Things New ...

Happy New Year, everyone! So how are the resolutions going? It's funny how the turning of the New Year inspires so many of us to re-focus our lives with resolutions designed to make us more like the people we think we *really want to be—healthier*, shinier, more successful versions of ourselves. I guess making New Year's resolutions is like hitting the "reset" button to our

lives—to make the most of another chance to "do life better." I suppose celebrating the New Year is celebrating *hope*.

As I was contemplating the year ahead, and all *my* hopes, a thought occurred to me that interrupted my yearly daydreaming. Instead of asking, "What do *I* hope for this year?" perhaps I should ask, "What does *God* hope for me this year?" I am reminded of Isaiah's words: "For my thoughts are not your thoughts, nor are your ways my ways, says the LORD. For as the heavens are higher than the earth, so are my ways higher than your ways and my thoughts than your thoughts" (Isaiah 55:8-9).

(2 Corinthians 5:17).

Let's all "do life better" this year—let's celebrate the hope above all hopes, Jesus Christ.


