## **GOT CALLUSED KNEES?**

*The prayer of the righteous is powerful and effective. (James 5:16b)*

On a recent afternoon, a woman stopped by the church seeking an emergency supply of food. Her surname, "Prayer," caught me so off guard, I instantly forgot her first name. She said she'd survived two brain aneurysms and had a tube permanently implanted in her head. When she told me her last name I said, "It works," meaning, prayer works. She agreed and said she believes in the power of prayer.

I must admit to feeling a bit self-conscious writing this piece. That's because I'm no expert on prayer. I remember one of my favorite seminary professors saying that he didn't know how to pray. This shocked me because I'd always appreciated how real and heartfelt his prayers were, and how humbly he offered them. The truth is, I don't know how to pray either, and I know I don't pray often

enough. Yet, I'm convinced that John Calvin was right when in his *Institutes of the Christian Religion* he wrote of "prayer, which is the chief exercise of faith, and by which we daily receive God's benefits."<sup>1</sup>

This congregation surely has its prayer warriors who intercede for and with our flock, for Christ's Church, and the world. Among them are probably some whose spontaneous prayers roll off their tongues like poetry; others' prayers may be sprinkled with Scripture. Still others' prayers may be notable for their simplicity, or for the humility, yet boldness and sincerity with which they're offered. Some people's minds scramble when asked to pray spontaneously in public; given time, they can compose eloquent written prayers.

Having said all that, the good news is that God doesn't care about such external things that can so easily distract us. God doesn't grade our prayers. What's important to God is *that* we pray—that we approach God with an attitude of reverence, humility, and submission, confessing our sins before God and seeking God's mercy and forgiveness. God wants us to acknowledge with thanksgiving the myriad of ways God so graciously blesses us. Last but not least, God is waiting to shower us with blessings, if we'd only ask for that which God wills to give us. How do we know what God wills to give us? Prayerfully seeking God's will as we read and study God's written word, Scripture, is one way. Spending intimate moments with God in prayer sanctified by the Holy Spirit is another. We may often overlook *listening as we pray* — for the guidance, conviction, and grace of God through the Holy Spirit. Room must be left for silence in our prayers.

I was speaking with a friend recently who lamented how many Christians flit about doing the work of the church in their own strength, and for whatever reason don't seek God's face in prayer. She remarked how weak church's witness is in such cases, leaving untapped the power of the Holy Spirit.

Calvin talks about the importance of prayer in times of difficulty, how rough times can draw us to God, whose counsel we otherwise might not seek. Times of transition are at least as challenging for churches as they are for individuals. As we go about Christ's work in this time of transition, trust that "the Spirit helps us in our weakness; for we do not know how to pray as we ought, but that very Spirit intercedes with sighs too deep for words. And God, who searches the heart, knows what is the mind of the Spirit, because the Spirit intercedes for the saints according to the will of God" (Rom. 8:26-27). Lord, teach us to pray (Luke 11:1).




**Come One – Come All!**

### Minutes of the Stewardship Committee Meeting Held on April 9, 2013

#### **STEWARDSHIP ISSUES**

Nothing to report.

#### **TREASURER'S REPORT**

Ed Benkert reported that the net for March was \$-3,431.20, which decreased our 2013 YTD balance to \$-2,266.44. In March we had to pay our semi-annual sewer bill and our 3 month water bill which amounted to \$2,100.00. Also in March, a one-time fund transfer of \$1,335.63 was transferred out of the General Fund and into the new committed Ladies' Tea fund account.

The recommendation to Session that all purchases must be approved by the appropriate Committee Chairperson before ordering and quantities must reflect the current quantity needed was approved by Session.

#### **PROPERTY CARE ISSUES**

##### **Lawn Maintenance**

**Bruce** will check with Bruce McKee, Jr., to get an estimate for this year's lawn maintenance. **Gary** will also check with his contacts to get an estimate for this year's lawn maintenance. The estimates should include cutting, edging and clean-up for the entire property, including the Manse.

##### **CE Building**

1. **Gary** will talk with Pezz Electric - may be interested in working as an on-call electrician for us.
2. **Wayne** will get a price on both a 4 yard and 2 yard dumpster to replace the one behind the gym. The old one must be taken away.

3. **Jake** had Spark Electric fix the light switch by JMH which worked the spotlights in the parking lot.

### **Sanctuary**

1. The bleed valve in the Sacristy area hot water system is corroded. There is heat right now. **To be reviewed in May/June timeframe.**
2. Two 95 gallon wheeled garbage and recycling cans are at the Sanctuary. Must determine when and who will put them out.
3. The No Parking sign was found on the ground. Will address at the 4/27 Spring Clean-Up.
4. Lights on church stone wall sign are not working - fixed by **Jake and Rich.**
5. **Wayne** will get a Susan Magnolia to replace the original Magnolia tree on Sanctuary lawn.
6. **Gary** will talk with Pezz Electric about putting up a spotlight on the Sanctuary to light up the parking lot.
7. Lights in Sanctuary need a scissor lift to be fixed. **Gary** will check with Pezz Electric.

### **Quiet Room**

Ceiling in back far left corner of room has water damage from a leak that has been fixed.

### **Gym**

1. **Jake** had Spark Electric change the ballast in the gym and the lights are working.
2. Back doors to parking lot are not closing properly - metal aluminum bar is bent.

### **Little Fiddler**

1. Clean-up furnace room in classroom in Westminster Hall (Head Start). Will need to clean with bleach, paint and replace some sheetrock. **Bruce** spoke with his son - need to wait for Little Fiddler to be out of building - **July issue**
2. Sump pump in Room 6 is unplugged. **Bruce** checked and there is no problem with sump pump. - **done.**

### **Annual Spring Clean-up**

Date set for Saturday, April 27<sup>th</sup>. **Recommendation approved.**

### **Manse**

1. The metal topper on the chimney fell off during hurricane Sandy.
2. Manse electric problems (**possibly addressed by Pezz**).

2. Some of the slate from the Chapel roof has fallen off.

**Wayne** will check if his office has welder that can fix can trailer and the door in JMH.

## In Our Denomination

Older Adult Sunday - May 5, 2013

Older Adult Week - May 5-11, 2013



Each year the Presbyterian Church (USA) designates the first Sunday in May as Older Adult Sunday, and the first week in May as Older Adult Week. The church planning calendar designates this time to acknowledge older adults as one of the gifts with which God has blessed us. We dedicate this week to older adults because they are the backbone of our church, our nation and the world. Older adults represent the gifts of wisdom gained through living a life in faith, hope through hard times lived with perseverance, and generosity in loving and stewardship. Older Adult Week is a moment to make a special effort to let our elders know they are cared for, loved, and never forgotten.

Take time to recognize, honor and pray for older church members on Older Adult Sunday, May 5, and throughout the week. Give thanks for the lives of older adults and the gifts they bring to the congregation. Recognize the courage it takes to stop driving, to accept assistance, to give up a home, and to depend on family and friends. Pray also for strength and courage for those who provide care for older persons.

## Presbyterian Heritage Sunday Sunday, May 26, 2013

Presbyterian Heritage Sunday is supported by the Presbyterian Historical Society and has been set aside by the General Assembly of the Presbyterian Church (USA) as an annual day to celebrate, reflect upon and learn more about the long and rich history of the Presbyterian movement in America.

The theme for Presbyterian Heritage Sunday 2013 is "**Communion Tokens.**"

Communion tokens were a familiar feature of Presbyterian worship in past centuries. The practice was brought to colonial America from Scotland. Most colonial congregations celebrated the Lord's Supper once or twice a year. A day or more before the communion service, the pastor and elders questioned the members of their congregation about their beliefs and behavior. Only those who showed adequate knowledge of the faith and were deemed to be living upright lives received tokens. During the communion service, communicants came forward and sat at long tables where they turned in their tokens and received the elements.

Most tokens were cast or stamped out of lead or pewter, but other materials were used including printed paper, ceramic and wood. Tokens of the 1700s tended to be plain – even crude – and were marked with the initials of the church or the pastor. An exception is the card token used by Rev. Samuel Davies in his Virginia congregation, one of the few known paper tokens of that era. In the 1800s, some churches adopted more elaborate designs, including Biblical references and symbols.

In the Presbyterian Church (USA), the use of tokens began to decline after 1825. By 1860, most congregations no longer used them. More conservative denominations – such as the United Presbyterian Church of North America and Reformed Presbyterians – often used tokens into the late 1800s and early 1900s. In recent decades, many churches have minted tokens as souvenirs for special celebrations and anniversary observances.


